CALLTO ORDER: 5:30PM

Board Meeting Minutes: David called for approval of the submitted board meeting minutes for March 6th, 2024. The minutes were approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report: Ed reviewed March 2024 financial statement. He reported 38 active members for 2024 as of the end of March. The March 2024 financial statement was approved as submitted.

Secretary's Report: Simon identified and apologized for an error in sending 2024 member cards to approximately 15 non-paid (2024) members. Likely most if not all will pay 2024 dues however Spike suggested a second follow-up email to those affected with attached club membership application. Simon will process.

NEW BUSINESS

April 20th Spring Field Cleanup

- Minimal Vole damage. Elliot will flag areas that need attention prior to the event.
- Bruce Morris has graciously agreed to bring his tractor to the field, Spike will roll the field after all damage is repaired. Many thanks Bruce
- Elliot suggested only a couple wheelbarrows and 5 gallon buckets would be needed as damage is quite minimal.
- Chainsaws are not needed as no tree damage as of April 2. Upcoming April 4th storm may affect this.

Porta-potty shall be serviced and open for use starting April 17th. Service cost has risen to \$60 per visit with one service per month for active months.

Spike stated the tractor service is scheduled for end of April. Tractor "Pilots' are Spike (primary) and Bill Liarsey (secondary). Additional pilots can be arranged as/ if required.
