#### CALL TO ORDER: 5:33PM

**Board Meeting Minutes:** All board members present voted to accept the November board minutes as submitted.

**Treasurer's Report:** Ed Ricker reviewed December 2023 financial statement. Several questions were asked, and answers provided by Ed. The December financial statement was approved as submitted.

**Secretary's Report:** Gate code will be changed after the Numb Thumbs event then 2024 membership cards can be emailed to paid members.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### Proposed Defibrillator at the Field

- Will require 8 to 10 members to be CPR trained and certified with a cost of approximately \$85 to \$90 per person.
- Liability was questioned however Maine has a "Good Samaritan" law that protects against arrest and prosecution should efforts fail to revive the patient.
- Elliot Randall reiterated that grants/monies are available to assist in the purchase of the defibrillator however not guaranteed.

• Suggested the secretary poll the membership to determine the level of interest in having a defibrillator at the field and also the interest by the membership to pay for and become CPR certified.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

David Dyer spoke about increasing youth involvement in the club. Several ideas were discussed including but not limited to: youth flying programs, Civil Air Patrol, Ace Camp, Camp Kaetcha, Ray & Robin's Hobby Shop flyer and youth oriented competitions.

#### Certificate of Waiver or Authentication

• David Dyer requested a list of pilots (Members) with FAA and AMA numbers. Ed Ricker will provide as this information already exists.

• In the event of a fly-away plane, information about the plane/event is required to be reported. This information includes certain plane geometry and characteristics as well as plane direction and altitude along with pilot information. It was suggested plane geometry and characteristics could be gleaned from the Internet as pilots know the model they are flying, pilot information is known and direction and altitude can be estimated.

• This document along with others are in a blue binder located in the club house at the flying field, all members need to know its location and what functions/ reporting need to be performed in the event of a "fly-away" or visit by an FAA official

• Binder also includes a map of the flying field and it boundaries. General discussion ensued.

• This was suggested to be reviewed during some of the field events and also noted in the monthly newsletter.

Discussed how the clubhouse is getting over filled with various planes, etc. Suggested they be stored elsewhere. To be discussed during spring clean-up or other event at the beginning of the next flying season.

• Frank Maguire presented his Balsa USA Excalibur plane he built from basic kit and discussed why he chose to build this particular model. It has no rudder controls and has twin vertical stabilizers which makes it unusual. It is nitro powered and Frank hopes to fly it this coming season. Frank is now starting the build of an Ultimate Biplane from just plans.

• David Dyer shared his progress on a small Guillow's Piper Cherokee balsa model powered by rubber. The basic airframe is complete and now needs covering and finishing. David also showed a beautiful cribbage board he had recently crafted.

## JUST A REMINDER Entrance Gate Procedure

**MONDAY THRU FRIDAY** - We are permitted to keep the gate swung open while we are flying from 8:00AM to 4:00PM. Last one out closes and locks the gate.

**ON WEEKENDS** - The gate must be swung closed but left unlocked by putting the chain over the gate.

In either situation make sure the padlock itself <u>is locked</u> on the chain so it does not disappear. Thanks!
