I would like to thank Spike for leading the Propsnappers through two years of continued operation, special events, and over some significant hurdles. These included working with all the entities to ensure we could continue to lease our site alongside the development of the solar "Farm". Spike worked

with the FAA to process our application for FRIA status at our Green Road field and the Kiwanis campground for our Spring and Fall float flies. We were able to maintain our club's Gold Status with the AMA thanks to his efforts. Spike has maintained the good relationship we have with Eco-Maine who manage the landfill property. We are grateful to Spike and Elliot for their successful efforts at finding our new porta-potty! Spike also kept us up to date on the remote ID program.

To give you a little bit of my background, I joined the club and received my wings in October of 2021 with Dan Desena as my flight instructor. Dan encouraged me to run for vice president for 2022, which I did partly because I was a new member, and also because the club needs to foster leadership opportunities for all members, but particularly new ones. So, after two years, here I am, ready to take on new challenges and opportunities as

president of the board. I live in Bath, which is about a 50-minute drive from the field. I work four days a week at Cooks Corner Hannaford in Brunswick, so I will not be able to be at the field as often as Spike was. I do expect Spike will continue to drop in, and he will continue mowing our field. Other members check on misc. things at the site. Elliot will continue with battery maintenance for the solar panels. Bill Larsey continues as our chief flight instructor. John Thibault will continue as our safety officer. Besides myself, the new board officers are: Jim McCoy, vice president; Simon Wilcox, secretary; and Ed Ricker returns as treasurer. The directors this year are Jeff Beuttell, Tony Blanchard, Elliot Randall, John Thibault, and our Ex Officio is Spike Enck.

With all the work that has been done to ensure continued use of our field both as a lessee and as a FAA authorized FRIA site, we now have a chance to focus energies on some new goals this coming year. Various members have told me that when I come to the field to fly I should have a goal for what I want to accomplish that day. The idea is that through disciplined practice we will improve our skills. My goal as Propsnappers president is to not attempt to fix something that is not broken. However, I'd like to leave the club with improved financials and increased membership (including students, and women). Another goal is to work with Bill Larsey and

his instructors to help beginner pilots transition to more intermediate skills. One thing I have learned this past year is how enjoyable, relaxing and helpful it is to hang out by the club house just talking and flying.

We will have our first board and member meeting on January 3, 2024 at Ray and Robin's. Our event schedule will be set including the upcoming Numb Thumbs in February. So, stay tuned for those dates and times.

For those who were unable to attend the annual Awards Banquet, we had a very enjoyable evening. Hopefully next year you will be able to attend the party. I need to apologize to David Cyr for not thanking him for the excellent video presentation he put together for the diner. It was a perfect complement to the festivities.

Important Field Updates

Effective December 9, 2023 the FAA Fixed Site Airspace Authorization (AA) became effective for our Green Road location and replaces our Letter of Agreement (LOA) with PWM. This five page document is now located in the club house in a blue three-ring binder and must be kept on location at all times should we be required to prove that we are a designated site per the FAA.

In addition, on the bulletin board you will find Exhibit A of our sublease with BD Solar Larson, LLC that shows the no-fly zone. Please review this to make sure all pilots are in compliance with the sublease.
